KAYLA'S PLAYGROUND SET TO REOPEN MONDAY, JULY 1, 2024

Franklin, WI. (June 28, 2024) – After four weeks of removing and replacing 12,000 square feet of surface, Kayla's Playground will reopen at 10am on Monday, July 1. The playground, which opened in 2015, was inspired by Kayla Runte, a special little girl with cerebral palsy who passed away in 2012. After her passing, Kayla's Krew was formed with the mission to build an all-inclusive and all-accessible playground for children with special needs to enjoy and forget about the challenges they face.

The playground has been open for nine years and the specialized cushioned play surface, which protects children from falls and provides easy mobility for wheelchairs, walkers and strollers, was in need of replacement. Kayla's mother, Shelly Runte, worked with the City of Franklin's Mayor John Nelson, Department Public Works, Kevin Schlueter and City Engineer, Glenn Morrow, to replace the playground surface.
