





BACKGROUND

The Franklin Department of Public Works (DPW) is requesting authorization to implement the retitling of three positions within the organization which will be filled by three current employees whom will vacate their existing positions, as part of an internal re-structuring process.

This change will allow our department to better address the needs of the City, the community, and the department, and will allow us to better align these positions with their existing job duties.

At the May 20th, 2024, Personnel Committee meeting, the Personnel Committee voted to recommend this request to the Common Council for approval.

ANALYSIS

The Department of Public Works is looking to convert the following positions:

- One (1) Heavy Equipment Operator (HEO) to a Foreman/HEO position.
- 2. One (1) Light Equipment Operator (LEO) to an Arborist/LEO position.
- 3. One (1) Light Equipment Operator (LEO) to an Assistant Mechanic/LEO position.

These positions will be posted internally once approved. The Department of Public Works is hoping to have these positions filled by current staff as of July 1st, 2024.

FISCAL NOTE

Staff recommends using funds from the 2024 Operating Budget (Salaries-Full Time, Acct #01-0331-5111), to cover the difference in wages for the three retitled positions. The estimated cost to implement these changes from July 1st through the end of 2024 would be approximately \$7,130.00. This increased cost would be covered by the salary from the current vacant position within the department.

BACKGROUND

Carma Laboratories, Inc has a developer's agreement with the City of Franklin dated October 24, 2023. As part of the developer's agreement, Carma Laboratories agreed to install a sidewalk valued at \$92,000 along their property within the Milwaukee County right-of-way for S. 76th Street (CTH U).

ANALYSIS

Milwaukee County requires that the City take ownership and responsibility for the sidewalk before a construction permit is approved. The attached resolution commits the City to own and maintain the sidewalk.

Note that clearing snow is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner per the Franklin Municipal Code:

§ 222-6 Snow and ice removal.

A. Owner to clean sidewalk. The owner of any building or lot fronting upon or adjoining any street shall clean or cause to be cleaned the sidewalk abutting such building or lot of snow and ice and shall cause the same to be kept clear of snow and ice within 24 hours after such snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumulate thereon, provided that when ice has so formed on any sidewalk that it cannot be removed, such person shall ensure safe traversing by applying an abrasive material or salt within the time period referred to herein.

OPTIONS

Accept or reject Resolution tanking ownership for a new City sidewalk along Carma Laboratories along S. 76th Street. Rejection of this resolution would not allow Carma to construct the sidewalk.

FISCAL NOTE

No impact to City budget. The cost of the sidewalk was previously negotiated in the Tax Increment Development agreement with Carma Laboratories.

BACKGROUND

On February 21, 2024, Common Council authorized Staff to advertise and bid the 2024 Local Street Preventative Maintenance Program Contract (LSPM).

The program includes rejuvenating seal coat and crack sealing. A rejuvenating seal coat is a spray on pavement preservation treatment applied to an existing asphalt pavement surface to preserve its functional and structural integrity. It will help prolong the life of quality pavement and delay degradation and more costly rehabilitation treatments. The spray on application is a thin coating of rejuvenating emulsion on the existing pavement which typically has fast cure times ranging from one to eight hours depending on the weather conditions. This will be similar to the seal coating that was performed in recent years throughout the City.

The program is anticipated to begin later this summer with completion in late August.



AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT, is made and entered into this 4th day of April, 2024, between the City of Franklin, 9229 West Loomis Road, Franklin, Wisconsin 53132 (hereinafter "CLIENT") and BCI Entertainment, LLC (hereinafter "CONTRACTOR"), whose principal place of business is 8425 WI 38, Caledonia, WI.

WITN ESSETH

WHEREAS, the CONTRACTOR is duly qualified and experienced as a municipal services contractor and has offered services for the purposes specified in this AGREEMENT; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of CLENT, it is necessary and advisable to obtain the services of the CONTRACTOR to provide a drone light show;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and the following mutual covenants, terms, and conditions, CLIENT and CONTRACTOR agree as follows:

I. BASIC SERVICES AND AGREEMENT ADMINISTRATION

- A. CONTRACTOR shall provide services to CLIENT for a drone light show on July 5th 2024, as described in CONTRACTOR's proposal to CLIENT dated 4/2/2024, annexed hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment A.
- B. CONTRACTOR shall serve as CLIENT's professional representative in matters to which this AGREEMENT applies. CONTRACTOR may employ the services of outside consultants and subcontractors when deemed necessary by CONTRACTOR to complete work under this AGREEMENT following approval by CLIENT
- C. CONTRACTOR is an independent contractor and all persons furnishing services hereunder are employees of, or independent subcontractors to, CONTRACTOR and not of CLIENT. All obligations under the Federal Insurance Contribution Act (FICA), the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA), and income tax withholding are the responsibility of CONTRACTOR as employer. CLIENT understands that express AGREEMENTS may exist between CONTRACTOR and its employees regarding extra work, competition, and nondisclosure.
- D. During the term of this AGREEMENT and throughout the period of performance of any resultant AGREEMENT, including extensions, modifications, or additions thereto, and for a period of one (1) year from the conclusion of such activity, the parties hereto agree that neither shall solicit for employment any technical or professional employees of the other without the prior written approval of the other party.

II. FEES AND PAYMENTS

CLIENT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR, for and in consideration of the performance of Basic Services further described in Attachment A, with a not-to-exceed budget of \$9,000, subject to the terms detailed below:

- A. CONTRACTOR may bill CLIENT and be paid for all work satisfactorily completed hereunder on a monthly basis. CLIENT agrees to pay CONTRACTOR's invoice within 30 days of invoice date for all approved work.
- B. Total price will not exceed budget of \$9,000. For services rendered, monthly invoices will include a report that clearly states the hours and type of work completed and the fee earned during the month being invoiced.
- C. In consideration of the faithful performance of this AGREEMENT, the CONTRACTOR will not exceed the fee for Basic Services and expenses without written authorization from CLIENT to perform work over and above that described in the original AGREEMENT.
- D. Should CLIENT find deficiencies in work performed or reported, it will notify CONTRACTOR in writing within thirty (30) days of receipt of invoice and related report and the CONTRACTOR will remedy the deficiencies within thirty (30) days of receiving CLIENT's review. This subsection shall not be construed to be a limitation of any rights or remedies otherwise available to CLIENT.

III. MODIFICATION AND ADDITIONAL SERVICES

A. CLIENT may, in writing, request changes in the Basic Services required to be performed by CONTRACTOR and require a specification of incremental or decremental costs prior to change order agreement under this AGREEMENT. Upon acceptance of the request of such changes, CONTRACTOR shall submit a "Change Order Request Form" to CLIENT for authorization and notice to proceed signature and return to CONTRACTOR. Should any such actual changes be made, an equitable adjustment will be made to compensate CONTRACTOR or reduce the fixed price, for any incremental or decremental labor or direct costs, respectively. Any claim by CONTRACTOR for adjustments hereunder must be made to CLIENT in writing no later than forty-five (45) days after receipt by CONTRACTOR of notice of such changes from CLIENT.

IV. ASSISTANCE AND CONTROL

- A. John Bergner will coordinate the work of the CONTRACTOR, and be solely responsible for communication within the CLIENT's organization as related to all issues originating under this AGREEMENT
- B. CLIENT will timely provide CONTRACTOR with all available information concerning PROJECT as deemed necessary by CONTRACTOR.
- C. CONTRACTOR will appoint, subject to the approval of CLIENT, Andy Ackmann as CONTRACTOR's Project Manager and other key providers of the Basic Services Substitution of other staff may occur only with the consent of CLIENT

V. TERMINATION

- A. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by CLIENT, for its convenience, for any or no reason, upon written notice to CONTRACTOR. This AGREEMENT may be terminated by CONTRACTOR upon thirty (30) days written notice. Upon such termination by CLIENT, CONTRACTOR shall be entitled to payment of such amount as shall fairly compensate CONTRACTOR for all work approved up to the date of termination, except that no amount shall be payable for any losses of revenue or profit from any source outside the scope of this AGREEMENT, including but not limited to, other actual or potential agreements for services with other parties.
- B. In the event that this AGREEMENT is terminated for any reason, CONTRACTOR shall deliver to CLIENT all data, reports, summaries, correspondence, and other written, printed, or tabulated material pertaining in any way to Basic Services that CONTRACTOR may have accumulated. Such material is to be delivered to CLIENT whether in completed form or in process. CLIENT shall hold CONTRACTOR harmless for any work that is incomplete due to early termination.
- C. The rights and remedies of CLIENT and CONTRACTOR under this section are not exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or appearing in any other article of this AGREEMENT.

VI. INSURANCE

The CONTRACTOR shall, during the life of the AGREEMENT, maintain insurance coverage with an authorized insurance carrier at least equal to the minimum limits set forth below:

A. General/Commercial Liability	\$1,000,000 per each occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage \$2,000,000 per general aggregate, CITY shall be named as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis
B. Automobile Liability	\$1,000,000 combined single limit CITY shall be named as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis
C. Contractor's Pollution Liability (Not applicable)	Not applicable

D Umbrella or Excess Liability Coverage for General/Commercial, Automobile Liability, and Contractor's Pollution Liability	\$10,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property CITY shall be named as an additional insured on a primary, non-contributory basis
E. Worker's Compensation and Employers' Liability	Statutory Contractor will provide a waiver of subrogation and/or any rights of recovery allowed under any workers' compensation law

Upon the execution of this AGREEMENT, CONTRACTOR shall supply CLIENT with a suitable statement certifying said protection and defining the terms of the policy issued, which shall specify that such protection shall not be cancelled without thirty (30) calendar days prior notice to CLIENT, and naming CLIENT as an additional insured as required above.

VII. INDEMNIFICATION AND ALLOCATION OF RISK

- A To the fullest extent permitted by law, CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless CLIENT, CLIENT'S officers, directors, partners, and employees from and against costs, losses, and damages (including but not limited to reasonable fees and charges of engineers, architects, attorneys, and other professionals, and reasonable court or arbitration or other dispute resolution costs) caused solely by the negligent acts or omissions of CONTRACTOR or CONTRACTOR'S officers, directors, partners, employees, and consultants in the performance of CONTRACTOR'S services under this AGREEMENT.
- B. Nothing contained within this AGREEMENT is intended to be a waiver or estoppel of the contracting municipality CLIENT or its insurer to rely upon the limitations, defenses, and immunities contained within Wisconsin law, including those contained within Wisconsin Statutes §§ 893.80, 895.52, and 345.05. To the extent that indemnification is available and enforceable, the municipality CLIENT or its insurer shall not be liable in indemnity or contribution for an amount greater than the limits of liability for municipal claims established by Wisconsin Law.

VIII. TIME FOR COMPLETION

CONTRACTOR shall commence work immediately having received a Notice to Proceed as of 4/4/2024

IX. DISPUTES

This AGREEMENT shall be construed under and governed by the laws of the State of Wisconsin. The venue for any actions arising under this AGREEMENT shall be the Circuit Court for Milwaukee County. The prevailing party shall be awarded its actual costs of any such litigation, including reasonable attorney fees.

X. RECORDS RETENTION

CONTRACTOR shall maintain all records pertaining to this AGREEMENT during the term of this AGREEMENT and for a period of 3 years following its completion. Such records shall be made available by the CONTRACTOR to CLIENT for inspection and copying upon request.

XI. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. Professionalism. The same degree of care, skill and diligence shall be exercised in the performance of the services as is possessed and exercised by a member of the same profession, currently practicing, under similar circumstances, and all persons providing such services under this AGREEMENT shall have such active certifications, licenses and permissions as may be required by law.
- B. Pursuant to Law. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary anywhere else set forth within this AGREEMENT, all services and any and all materials and/or products provided by CONTRACTOR under this AGREEMENT shall be in compliance with all applicable governmental laws, statutes, decisions, codes, rules, orders, and ordinances, be they Federal, State, County or Local.
- C. Conflict of Interest. CONTRACTOR warrants that neither it nor any of its affiliates has any financial or other personal interest that would conflict in any manner with the performance of the services under this Agreement and that neither it nor any of its affiliates will acquire directly or indirectly any such interest. CONTRACTOR warrants that it will immediately notify the CLIENT if any actual or potential conflict of interest arises or becomes known to the CONTRACTOR. Upon receipt of such notification, a CLIENT review and written approval is required for the CLIENT to continue to perform work under this Agreement.
- D. This AGREEMENT may only be amended by written instrument signed by both CLIENT and CONTRACTOR.

XII. CONTROLLING TERMS AND PROVISIONS

The aforesaid terms and provisions shall control over any conflicting term or provision of any CONTRACTOR proposal, Attachment, Exhibit, and standard terms and provisions annexed hereto.

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
